Wirral to the World

- Passport system after RWI to embed reading skills/strategies and encourage positive reading habits
- Range of text types to provide a varied reading 'diet'
- Continually supplementing and replenishing passport boxes
- Recently added texts from the Reflect series (OUP)

Curriculum Texts

- Range of high quality texts used in English and across different subjects to link to learning/ stimulus
- Books displayed in classrooms and further material in library for children to access a range of fiction and non-fiction texts

Home-School Partnership

- Library/free choice books to share at home with a reading log (Y1-Y6)
- Information shared via tapestry, newsletters, meetings and twitter
- Virtual classroom links, RWI book bag books (guidance), passport books
- Reading League and Book Camp (reading regularly '5 and sign')
- Parent/adult volunteers to listen to children read
- Book fairs, author visits (in person/virtual)
- Mystery Reader (parent/carers/family member) in Year 1

- A set of stories, books and related activities that complement our languages curriculum in KS2 at Raeburn
- Clockwork Methodology a unique approach to language learning that gradually introduces children to new words and phrases through beautifully illustrated stories
