This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

## Part A: Curriculum music

Music is taught in class every other week and is informed by the model music curriculum (March 2021). Lessons are an hour long and are taught by a music specialist or the class teacher. The musical learning is further supplemented by singing in assembly each week, lasting 10 minutes.

Children in years 1-6 are taught by a specialist music teacher from Musical Minds. We have worked very closely with them to ensure our curriculum is in line with the Model Music Curriculum. The curriculum is split into 5 areas of focus. These are perform, compose, transcribe, listening and describe and history.

KS1 children learn about the families of instruments, simple music notes and names and then they use these to play simple songs. Children in KS2 learn an instrument as a whole-class ensemble taught by specialists from Musical Minds. They focus on an instrument for 6 weeks at a time, which means they learn how to play 3 instruments a year.

## Part B: Extra-curricular music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

At Raeburn Primary School, we offer individual and small-group music lessons on string, percussion, woodwind and brass musical instruments through Musical Minds. Teachers visit the school and teach children in our dedicated music practise room.

We have a Key Stage 2 choir who meet weekly and learn a variety of songs. This is led by our deputy head.
